### VILLAGE OF SHELL **LAKE**

As you well know it has been most difficult to fill the potholes on the streets with the constant rain. The mild winter certainly took a tole on our streets but we will work on them as we can.

In past years we used to have a designated cleanup day in the Village but lately we leave it up the the individuals and the businesses to continuously keep their property clean and tidy. I encourage everyone to take a walk around your property and look at it from an outsiders point of view. What do you see? A well manicured lawn, healthy shrubbery free from trapped garbage, or a collection of shacks, vehicles and rubble. I don't think we have a rodent problem but an accumulation of stuff does give a home to skunks, and other unwelcome guests. We actually receive many compliments on the attractiveness of our Village so if you are deserving ....pat yourself on the back and thank you on behalf of council.

As soon as the "big bin" is full we will be sending it back. In the fall we will bring in a "metal Bin" if you can store your metal ware till then.

Still on the subject of garbage, we would prefer that leaves be put in the disposable paper bags or

cardboard boxes rather than plastic bags. Also because the ravens, cats and foxes have a habit of picking holes in bags it would be good to place your bags in a can or a stand as the maintenance worker is not required to pick up scattered garbage. Keep in mind the three bag limit for weekly garbage pickup. Thankyou for co-operating.
